



Jobs

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), which helps low-income families to afford nutritious foods and reduces hunger, was responsible for 249,720 U.S. grocery industry jobs. SNAP drove additional job growth of nearly 138,976 jobs in supporting industries, including agriculture, manufacturing, transportation and municipal services.



Wages

The jobs required to administer SNAP at the grocery store level generated more than \$10.3 billion in grocery industry wages. Paychecks earned by workers in supporting industries push the total to more than \$20.1 billion.



Federal Taxes

While SNAP purchases are not subject to sales taxes, sales helped generate additional tax activity at the federal level. SNAP purchase activity at retail stores is responsible for generating more than \$2.6 billion for 2025 federal tax receipts.



State and Local Taxes

SNAP purchases are not directly taxable, however, SNAP sales and administration at the grocery store level contributes to more than \$1.9 billion in state and local taxes in 2025.
